Mah Jongg is More Than a Game Explore the history, play 'mahj' within exhibit

MILWAUKEE, Wisconsin – An exhibit honoring the memories, legacy and charms of the game of mah jongg — including live action playing — opens June 5 at Jewish Museum Milwaukee, 1360 N. Prospect Ave.

Since the 1920s, the game of mah jongg has ignited the popular imagination with its beautiful tiles, mythical origins and communal spirit. "Project Mah Jongg" chronicles the history and meaning of the beloved game that became a Jewish-American tradition, complete with exciting artifacts, vintage photos and guided play sessions for both the beginner and experienced player. The environment conveys how mah jongg is much more than a game: it is a carrier of fantasy, identity, memory and meaning.

This acclaimed traveling exhibit is curated and circulated by the Museum of Jewish Heritage-A Living Memorial to the Holocaust, New York, and is supplemented with local material for its debut in the Midwest.

A preview reception on June 2 — "Mah Jongg, Martinis and Madness!" — will include mah jongg-inspired improv with Comedy Sportz.
