COUNCIL POSITION AND PROGRAM GOALS
REGARDING THE PEACE PROCESS

The Milwaukee Jewish Council adopts as its own goals two positions which had been adopted by the 1993 NJCRAC Plenum for inclusion in the 1993-94 NJCRAC Joint Program Plan:

1. A priority strategic goal [for the Milwaukee Jewish Council] is to develop programs to educate the community about the significance and urgency of the peace process, and to publicly manifest the community's support for continued progress in the negotiations.
2. A priority strategic goal [for the Milwaukee Jewish Council] is to interpret to the Administration, Congress, and influentials the urgency of defusing the Arab-Israeli conflict through the peace process before regional proliferation of long-range missiles and unconventional weapons drastically increases the dangers of war.
