January 4, 1996: Recommended by the Task Force on Anti-Semitism and Constitutional Law.

January 10, 1996: Recommended by the Executive Committee.

January 17, 1996: Approved by the Board of Directors

Position on Legislation Regarding Domestic Militia:

Due to the anti-Semitic orientation of most domestic militia groups, the Council endorses two additional proposals for state laws regarding militia:

- a. expanding and increasing <u>criminal penalties</u> for slander of title, simulating legal process and falsely assuming to act as a public officer, such as 1995 Senate Bill 437.
- b. revisions to real estate <u>civil procedures</u> to make it harder to file illegal liens and to expedite removal of those liens by a variety of changes such as requiring the listing of the name and address of a lien filer, deeming that notice to a lien filer is sufficient to have a hearing on a motion to remove a lien, and expediting procedures for removal of false liens.

[Previously, the Board had endorsed two other legislative initiatives, namely (1) a ban on private armies; and (2) criminal penalties for para-military instructors when there is evidence that their intent in providing the people they trained would cause a civil disturbance.]
