Lifetime Impact Award Dr. Steven Baruch

Dr. Steven Baruch and his wife Judy settled in Milwaukee in 1967 subsequent to Steven receiving his Bachelor's and Master's degrees at the University of Wisconsin in Madison.

Steve worked in Milwaukee Public Schools (MPS) serving as a middle school and high school teacher, Multicultural Curriculum Developer, and Coordinator of the MPS Leadership Academy. He received his Ph.D. in Urban Education from UWM in 1982. His dissertation was awarded first prize by the Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development in 1983. Steve co-authored



several articles and other publications about education in Milwaukee often in collaboration with Dr. Rolland Callaway.

In the 1980s Steve had become principal of the Congregation Anshai Lebowitz religious school. This volunteer position led to involvement in the Milwaukee Jewish Principals Council, MAJE (Milwaukee Association for Jewish Education), the Milwaukee Jewish Federation, and many other Jewish communal organizations.

After 32 years of service, Steve retired from MPS. He had been active in the process of creating the Coalition for Jewish Learning. Upon retirement he was appointed interim director of CJL and eventually became Director for the next 15 years. During this time his focus was on making CJL a coalition builder supporting excellence in Jewish education throughout the community.

Steve and Judy are proud parents of Laura Baruch Sherman and Charlie Sherman as well as David and Helen Baruch who have made them the grandparents of seven wonderful grandchildren. He is currently Co-President of Congregation Anshai Sfard Kehillat Torah (ASKT).

Levy Family CJL Jewish Educator of the Year Yael Gal-Ben-Yitschak



Yael Gal-Ben-Yitschak is a native of Israel now living in Milwaukee. She has been teaching Hebrew as a foreign language to all ages for the last 16 years. She taught Hebrew and Jewish Studies at the Milwaukee Jewish Day School and local synagogues for ten years and she is currently teaching Hebrew at the University of Wisconsin - Milwaukee and Nicolet High School.

Yael received her Bachelor of Arts in Education and English as a Foreign Language from Haifa University and Master's degree in teaching Hebrew as a second language from Middlebury College. She also has a

Master-Teacher's certificate from Hebrew College in Massachusetts.

Yael instills the love for the Hebrew language and its culture in her students, by offering them opportunities to be engaged through Hebrew club, Hebrew Honor Society, fundraising activities to support Israeli organizations such as Magen David Adom and for the first time this year, traveling to Israel as part of a language exchange program.

2020 Gill Incentive for Teachers (GIFT) Award

The Gill Incentive for Teachers (GIFT) is an award designed to stimulate and encourage teachers to translate their unique educational ideas and initiatives into effective classroom projects. This award is for a project completed during the current school year in one of these areas:

- School/classroom environment
- Teaching/learning materials
- Enrichment activities, including special one-time class/school projects



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Jodie Honigman World Zionist Congress

Students in 6th and 7th grade at Milwaukee Jewish Day School learned about the Jewish Question and the history of antisemitism. They were engaged in deep learning that led up to the First World Zionist Congress in 1897. They learned about Jewish communities around the world, and worked as teams to develop their ideas about Zionism from the perspective of their country. They chose and cooked food that represented the Jews in their country (knafeh, strudel, matzah ball soup, rugelach, hummus) and came to the presentation dressed up as the real representatives of the Congress. Students facilitated the Congress themselves and engaged in high level discussion about the future of the Jewish people. After the Congress, students reflected and came to their own personal conclusions about how Zionism plays a role in the Jewish future.



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Sherry Miller and Tamara Miller Madrichim Training Program

The goal of the Congregation Emanu-El B'ne Jeshurun Madrich Training Project was two-fold: 1) to offer the students information, encouragement, and support and 2) to increase the breadth and depth of the madrichim the religious school teachers rely on. Achieving these goals led to the 8th through 12th graders remaining engaged at religious school.



The madrich training took place the last 40 minutes of Sunday School during the 2018-19 school year at CEEBJ. This time slot usually coincided with the time when the younger students were in Tefillah or in library time. Moreover, this time slot was convenient for the parents who also had younger children attending religious school. This was the solution to the potentially opposing concerns about maximizing the time the madrichim spent in the classroom and scheduling the class at a time convenient to the madrichim and their parents. Holding the madrich training during regularly scheduled religious school didn't require parents to make another trip back to synagogue or to wait around after religious school ended. And the teachers, although they could use the madrichim every moment, were only missing their madrichim during class times when other adult assistance was available if it was needed.


