Purim

The holiday of *Purim* is on the 14th day of the month of *Adar*. This year *Purim* falls on Friday, February 26. The day before, Thursday, February 25 is the Fast of Esther. In Milwaukee, the fast is from 5:05 am until 6:05 pm.

On *Purim* we celebrate hidden miracles. A quick read of the *Megillah* might lead us to believe that the Jews were saved from wicked Haman by mere chance. A deeper dive shows us that God's hand

was evident throughout the story, providing the solutions before the problems.

So let us celebrate in our *Purim* mask, as we focus on the 4 *mitzvot* of *Purim*:

- 1. Megillah Listening to the story of Purim (מְגִלָה)
- 2. Se'udat Purim Having a festive Purim meal (סעדת פורים)
- 3. Matanot L'evyonim Giving to the poor (מַתַנוֹת לְעֵבִיוֹנִים)
- 4. Mishloach Manot Exchanging of gifts (מִשְלוֹחַ מַנוֹת)


increased risk for violence in their relationships during this time. If you or someone you know is in danger, remember that you/they are not alone.
