- 2. Demonstrate leadership within the field of Jewish education.
- 3. Inspire students with a love for Jewish learning.
- 4. Personify the Jewish ideals of love of learning and search for knowledge.
- 5. Have contributed to the elevation of the status of Jewish educators within the Jewish community.
- 6. Engaged in the delivery of Jewish content on an ongoing basis.

This award is sponsored by Mark and Cindy Levy, who have been dedicated to Jewish education for many years. Cindy was a long-time member of the CJL advisory board. Mark and Cindy are very involved at their synagogue, Congregation Emanu-El of Waukesha. As supporters of Jewish education in Milwaukee, they wanted to elevate the status of our high-quality educators in Milwaukee by funding this Jewish Educator of the Year Award. Rivkie Spalter

Mequon Jewish Preschool

Rivkie Spalter, Director of Mequon Jewish Preschool, began

her first years of life in London, England. Her parents are Chabad emissaries who eventually moved to Mequon. She grew up in Brooklyn, Houston, and finally Milwaukee where her parents trailblazed a path of seeing everybody as an integral role in the greater community.

Rivkie opened Mequon Jewish Preschool, a core part of the Peltz Center for Jewish Life, in 1999 with the collaboration and determination of Dr. Robert and Sharon Kliegman. The school began with five children in her parents' home that generated Chabad of Mequon.

As a Chabad Shlucha (emissary) of Lubavitch of Wisconsin, she knew that her desire was to integrate the school's Jewish identity with progressive educational approaches. She chose the Reggio Emilia approach because of their recognition of the potential and competence in every child from birth.

For that integration, organizational changes were required including creating a Judaic team, studying core aspects of our Judaism through Chassidic teachings and Kabbalah, with weaving ideas from the Reggio Emilia approach with Dr. Naama Zoran (since 2008) through today.

The school grew to be a compass to other schools too by creating learning opportunities for schools across the Milwaukee community and collaborates with parents, grandparents, educators, children, preschool alumni, and community.

Rivkie and her husband Rabbi Motty Spalter live in Mequon. They are filled with gratitude for their 10 children, some of whom are currently educators at Mequon Jewish preschool, and many grandchildren.

ABOUT THE AWARD

Five times before, the Coalition for Jewish Learning has recognized a member of the Milwaukee Jewish Community with a Lifetime Impact Award. This award is given to someone who has dedicated his or her life to improving Jewish education. People receiving this award have contributed to Jewish education throughout many decades of work.



CJL Lifetime Impact Award Doris Shneidman

Founding director of Milwaukee Jewish Day School

Doris Shneidman grew up in Chicago where her family were

founding members of Beth Emet Synagogue in Evanston. She enjoyed some summers at OSRUI and was an active member of NFTY.

Doris received her B.S. from UW-Madison where she met and married Dan Shneidman, z'l. They moved to Milwaukee, and she began teaching at Atwater School. While raising their four children, Doris studied remedial reading techniques at UWM, earning a master's degree and certification as a reading specialist. She taught graduate courses and supervised reading tutors at the clinics at UWM and Marquette University. In 1981, she earned a Ph.D in Educational Administration at Marquette. Rabbi Silberg approached Doris to consider heading up a new pluralistic community Jewish Day School. After five other rabbis, ten families, and two teachers agreed to "found" the school, MJDS opened in 1981.

Doris says, "My years working with such an incredible staff, devoted families, and a supportive Federation were a dream come true for a Jewish educator." Since retiring, Doris spends her time enjoying her family and friends, especially her former coworkers.

He was still teaching up until two weeks before he died at the age of 97, and like Moses at the age of 120, "his vision had not dimmed nor had his vigor abated." In addition to his primary focus on education, Rabbi Brickman brought Jungian thought, dream interpretation and counseling to his sacred work.

Cece Parkes, Lydia and Nason Lancina School Support Award

Cece Parkes, Lydia and Nason Lancina, are high school seniors who have devoted their Sundays to serving as Madrichim at Congregation Sinai's youth education program. Cece has worked with our youngest

2022 GILL INCENTIVE FOR TEACHERS (GIFT) AWARD

The Gill Incentive for Teachers (GIFT) is an award designed to stimulate and encourage teachers to translate their unique educational ideas and initiatives into effective classroom projects.



2022 Gill Incentive for Teachers (GIFT) Award Roger Carp

This year's GIFT award goes to Roger Carp of Congregation Shalom for his project, A Modern Railroad Journey Through the Land of the Judges, Kings, and Prophets of Ancient Israel. This project was done during the 2019-2020 school year.

Roger Carp has been teaching in the Religious School at Congregation Shalom since 1993. He has taught every grade from fifth through ninth, but has mostly been working with the 10- and 11-year-old boys and girls in fifth grade. Along the way, he earned a master's degree in Judaic Studies from Spertus Institute in Chicago, along with four previous GIFT Awards from CJL and its predecessor, MAJE. Roger has benefited from educational classes and programs offered through both agencies, and they have impressed upon him the importance of meeting each student where he or she feels most comfortable and learns best. As a result, he has made art projects, drama, music, and yoga significant elements in his teaching of Jewish holidays, life-cycle events, Jewish ethics and rituals, and Torah.

The focus of this year-long project was teaching students Jewish history from the time the Israelites entered the Promised Land after the Exodus

from Egypt through the establishment of a monarchy. Students benefited from learning about this seldom-taught part of Jewish history, in an innovative, creative, and enjoyable way that included text study, class discussion, collaborative learning, woodworking, painting, and modeling with different materials. Students became familiar with important Judges (specifically, Joshua, Deborah, and Samson), Kings (specifically, Saul, David, and Solomon), and Prophets (specifically, Elijah and Elisha).

The project was a fifth through seventh grade elective. The project was a "tourist railroad" used to transport travelers between historic sites and through scenery with great beauty and interest. Students were to create a miniature version of such a tourist railroad on a 4×8 -foot sheet of plywood that in their imagination would bring modern-day tourists from one historic site within Israel to another – sites related to the stories of Judges, Kings, and Prophets found in Nevi'im. Students would first study an assortment of stories and become familiar with their main characters, geographical settings, and lessons as related to the history of the Jewish people.

Unfortunately, because of the pandemic, school went virtual in March 2020, so the project was never fully completed. Nevertheless, students gained a great deal of knowledge about a section of the Tanakh and events in ancient Jewish history they had never previously been exposed to while in religious school. They learned how the study of the Tanakh, like that of the geography of Israel, could be applied with relevance to their lives.

This project impressed the committee with its depth of learning, its project-based learning approach to the curriculum, and the innovative method to teach text. Roger kept detailed notes of the project and it is highly replicable. Contact CJL to learn more about the project.


