

2023 Levy Family CJL Jewish Educator of the Year

Marilyn Franklin

Marilyn Franklin was born in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, to Ruth and Julius Kohler. She grew up on the "West Side," a very Jewish part of the city at that time. Her desire to teach in a congregational school developed because of the comfort she felt being a part of such a close knit community. Marilyn's grandparents were Orthodox Jews. They had a strong influence on her Jewish life as did her Conservative parents: the entire family shared many observances together both in the synagogue and home. As a young girl, Marilyn attended Garfinkel's Hebrew School learning not only Hebrew and Yiddish, but also gaining the true meaning of "Yiddishkeit;" something that has remained with her to this day.

Always wanting to be a teacher, Marilyn graduated from the University of Wisconsin—Madison School of Education with a BS in Secondary Education and taught junior high English for several years.

Though being a stay-at-home wife and mom was enjoyable, she missed being in the classroom. Marilyn reached out to Congregation Shalom; by chance, the religious school was in need of a second



grade teacher who could inspire the love of Judaism in young children. It was then that Marilyn began her now 50 year tenure.

At the same time she also found another rewarding niche. Active in public education, she won election to the local elementary school board in 1977 and was elected and still is a member of the Nicolet School Board since 1988. Always cognizant of Jewish students in the schools, she continues to be an advocate on their behalf.

Marilyn and her husband David live in Fox Point. Their family includes Scott, Amber, Melanie, Laci, Andy, Alla, Alex, and Julianna.

ABOUT THE AWARD

Six times before, the Coalition for Jewish Learning has recognized a member of the Milwaukee Jewish Community with a Lifetime Impact Award. This award is given to someone who has dedicated his or her life to improving Jewish Education. People receiving this award have contributed to Jewish education throughout many decades of work.

Dr. Sherry Blumberg

Sherry Blumberg (nee Sherry Sacks), began teaching in Jewish settings when she was 17. She has her Masters in Jewish Education and her Ph.D. in Jewish education from Hebrew Union College. She has served as congregational educator in both northern and southern California, Illinois and Wisconsin and as teacher of children in Arizona. Milwaukee, and New York. She was the first full time woman hired to teach at HUC, New York and served for 14 years on the faculty. She has taught in Reform, Conservative and Orthodox settings. She has co-published works on Teaching about God and Spirituality as well as being on the Editorial Committee for the Women's Torah Commentary. Today she teaches 3 Women's Torah



Classes, and substitutes when needed in various places. She has also taught at UWM, Cardinal Stritch, and two Catholic seminaries.

Sherry was married to David Blumberg z'l, lawyer and cantorial soloist. They have an adopted son, Joshua, and three foster daughters.

Each class learned about personfirst language, truths and myths about disabilities, and different types of disabilities.

Stephanie is the School Counselor at Bader Hillel Academy, Before moving to Wisconsin, she taught in Florida and New York. She is currently enrolled in the University of Wisconsin-Superior Master's Degree in School Counseling program. She has an Advanced Graduate Certificate in Gifted Education, a Master's Degree in General and Special Education, and a Bachelor's Degree in History. Stephanie has been teaching for eighteen years and strives to provide support, resources, and advocacy about the importance of social emotional learning and inclusion for our students, families, staff, and community. During the summer months, you can find Stephanie at Camp Gan Israel as the Camper Care Specialist. Stephanie and her husband, Seth are the proud parents of Jeremy and



Zachary. They love to travel the country and the world, go to baseball games, and go to Disney World. Stephanie is thankful for the amazing partnership Bader Hillel Academy has with the Friendship Circle and is honored to be recognized along with Leah for this meaningful award!

Then Middle School students met with Leah Stein, co-director of Friendship Circle via zoom. They also shared a pre-recorded video of employees from the Friendship Circle with disabilities to help build students' empathy and inclusion skills. After the lesson and presentation, staff observed students showing more kindness, empathy, and inclusion towards peers and staff.

Leah Stein

Friendship Circle

Leah Stein, MS SpEd, born and raised in New York City, has been honored to work with individuals with disabilities for over 16 years in various capacities. After receiving a Masters degree in special education and administrative education, Leah worked in the New York Board of Education, as a cognitive and behavioral therapist. Experiencing one-on-one life struggles with children with varying abilities, Leah saw the importance of socialization and the lack of this vital treasure in the lives of people with special needs. Leah moved to Milwaukee in 2016 to direct the Friendship Circle of Wisconsin, an organization that gives friendship and support to individuals with disabilities and their families. Friendship Circle is a division of Lubavitch of Wisconsin, Leah



and her husband, Rabbi Levi Stein also established Friendship Bakery, Cafe and Art Studio, an employment training program for adults with disabilities. Leah is inspired daily by the power of friendship, inclusion and the amazing community of Milwaukee.

This year's second GIFT award goes to Moria Lehman of Milwaukee Jewish Day School for her project, *Jewish Studies elective class on Israel's declaration of Independence.*

This project was a Jewish Studies class for 5th-7th graders. Through in-depth reading of Israel's Declaration of Independence, accompanied by other supporting texts, students learned the history of the Jewish connection to Israel. Then they learned the second part of the declaration, that includes the values upon which the state of Israel is built. They explored the values and researched modern conflicts around those values in the state of Israel today. The whole curriculum was created by the teacher. She felt there was a need for a new approach for Israel education in our upper school classes, so she created a whole new curriculum that used one text as the basis for both historic learning and student-led research. A lot of the work was student owned especially in the second half of the course where the students chose their own values and chose a conflict in modern Israel based on their interests.

Moria Lehman

Milwaukee Jewish Day School

Moria Lehman grew up and spent most of her adult life in Israel, in the city she loves most, Jerusalem. As a teenager, Moria was active in a youth movement and in non-formal education. Her first teaching experience was in the army where she served as a teacher-soldier in a youth village for new immigrants. Moria studied in the Hebrew University in Jerusalem where she got her BA in theater and interdisciplinary studies, and her MA in nonprofit management. Moria received a teaching certificate in theater, literature and Jewish Studies from "Kerem" institute for teachers in Jerusalem and worked as a teacher in a high school.

Moria moved to Milwaukee 4 years ago with her family when her husband became the



community Shaliach. Since then she's been teaching Hebrew and Jewish Studies in MJDS, which also became a school and a nurturing community to her three kids, Nadav, Ronnie and Yuval.

ABOUT THE AWARD

The Teacher Impact Award is given to a teacher who has made a special impact on their school community. This is not a "best teacher" award but rather recognition of a teacher who has made special contributions in an area such as mentoring, innovating, or helping others.


