Business & Professional Network

The Business & Professional Network offers professionals a host of opportunities to come together with other like-minded community members and philanthropists. It is a giving society that offers members opportunities for engagement and education with others who share similar values.

There are four divisions:
1) Maimonides (Healthcare) - all medical/healthcare professionals; 2) Cardozo (Legal) - all legal professionals; 3) Real Estate - all real estate professionals; 4) General Business/Finance - all business, commerce, and financial professionals.

Membership benefits include community access and networking at events; compelling content and topical events; leadership and volunteer opportunities within the Jewish community; a forum to discuss issues from a Jewish perspective; and a mentorship program.

Community Campaign

The Community Campaign is comprised of donors who give under \$1,000 annually. From young professionals and families beginning their philanthropic journeys to donors who have been giving for 50 years or more, participating in the Community Campaign is an excellent way for community members to express their Jewish values and show their support for the Jewish community in Milwaukee, Israel, and around the world.

NextGen MKE

NextGen MKE is comprised of individuals aged 22-45 in all stages of life. It focuses on engagement, leadership, and philanthropy, ensuring that the Milwaukee Jewish community goes from strength to strength across the generations. NextGen engages the community's young leaders by developing the skills needed to guide the Milwaukee Jewish community now and into the future, and by providing them with social, philanthropic, networking, and learning opportunities.

Giving Societies

Ben Gurion Society (BGS): Locally and nationally recognizes young adults ages 22-45 who demonstrate community leadership and philanthropy by supporting our community through an Annual Campaign gift of \$1,000 or more.

National Young Leadership Cabinet: The Jewish Federations of North America's "Cabinet" cultivates, trains, and inspires the most promising young volunteers for positions of leadership in the Jewish



community. In addition to being 30-40 years old and being nominated by a Federation professional, individuals must apply to be accepted, and commit to a minimum \$5,000 gift each year to the MJF Annual Campaign.

Women's Philanthropy

Women's Philanthropy of the Milwaukee Jewish Federation empowers women to become philanthropists and leaders.

Milwaukee Jewish women are change-makers and community-shapers. They are sisters and daughters, mothers and friends, compassionate and committed women at every stage of life and career.

Women's Philanthropy engages Jewish women in the fulfilling work of making the world a better place. They are building and supporting Jewish life for today and for generations to come. Members provide women confidence to assert their power through philanthropic giving, the skills to assume positions of leadership in the community, and the

opportunities to enhance relationships with like-minded women.

Giving Societies

The Pearl Society — Give From the Heart: Recognizes women aged 45 and younger who give from the heart and desire to engage with the community through philanthropy. These women give an individual or family gift to the Annual Campaign of \$360-\$1,799.

The Pomegranate Society — Plant for the Future: Pomegranate members nurture, sustain, and plant seeds for the future of our community. The Pomegranate Society recognizes women of any age giving an individual or family gift to the Annual Campaign of \$1,800-\$4,999.

Lion of Judah — Commit to Community: The Lion of Judah is a symbol of today's Jewish woman's strength, her caring about the Jewish people, and her financial commitment to the Milwaukee Jewish Federation's Annual Campaign. Lions of Judah are a global sisterhood of 17,500 women and is a symbol for a woman's individual or family gift of \$5,000 or more to the Milwaukee Jewish Federation's Annual Campaign.

The Forever Lion — Realize Your Vision: Today's Jewish woman can perpetuate her own name and her own commitment to Jewish continuity by establishing a Lion of Judah Endowment (LOJE), a fund that permanently endows a woman's \$5,000 or more annual gift to the Milwaukee Jewish Federation's Annual Campaign. It is a powerful statement of a woman's commitment to tzedakah, providing a legacy for herself, her family, and the community for generations to come.
