Chava Edelman grew up in Seattle, Washington, as the daughter of a Chabad rabbi and rebbetzin, where she developed a passion for Jewish community building and education. Inspired by the Lubavitcher Rebbe's renowned love for every single Jew. Chava decided at a young age that she wanted to dedicate her life to the Rebbe's mission and vision of reaching out to every Jew with love. Since the age of 14, Chava has worked in Jewish supplementary schools and day schools, and takes great joy in working with students to find fun ways to make their Judaism come alive - the most rewarding part of teaching is seeing the students' excitement and pride in their heritage.

From serving as assistant director of education at the Jewish Children's Museum in New York, to establishing a Jewish Discovery Center in Olympia, Washington, Chava has enjoyed many opportunities to learn about building



Jewish community and creating Jewish educational experiences.

The Edelmans were hired in 2016 by Lubavitch of Wisconsin to serve as directors of The Shul Center in Bayside. Chava initially focused on The Shul's programming, and then became the director at The Shul's Milwaukee Community Hebrew School in 2017. Chava and her husband, Rabbi Cheski Edelman, live in Bayside with their five children - Sender, Rosie, Fishel, Fayga, and Mushka.

2024 CJL Lifetime Impact Award

ABOUT THE AWARD

Six times before, the Coalition for Jewish Learning has recognized a member of the Milwaukee Jewish Community with a Lifetime Impact Award. This award is given to someone who has dedicated his or her life to improving Jewish Education. People receiving this award have contributed to Jewish education throughout many decades of work.

Cantor Karen Berman

In addition to her 35-year association with her beloved Congregation Shalom, Cantor Karen Berman has had the privilege of teaching and singing in the Milwaukee Jewish Community since 1970. A graduate of the UW - Milwaukee, she has a B.S. in Geography and Hebrew studies and a master's degree in education. She used those skills to help create some of the first Hebrew classes designed for students with learning challenges. Cantor Berman is a past recipient of CJL's Educator of the Year Award.

Her tenure at Congregation Emanu-El B'ne Jeshurun spanned 16 years, during which she had the chance to work under the tutelage of her mentor, Michael Fefferman. Cantor Berman was equally fortunate to teach at other congregations, including Cnesses Israel Synagogue in Green Bay, Temple Menorah, and Congregation Sinai. She



also spent more than a decade on the Milwaukee Jewish Day School faculty, teaching Hebrew to kindergarten students.

Throughout her long career, Cantor Berman has enjoyed working with learners of all ages, from toddlers to octogenarians. She feels blessed to have worked with and learned from hundreds of educators, rabbis, students, and parents of this wonderful community.

ABOUT THE AWARD

The Gill Incentive for Teachers (GIFT) is an award designed to stimulate and encourage teachers to translate their unique educational ideas and initiatives into effective classroom projects. This award is for a project completed during the current school year in one of these areas:

- School/classroom culture
- Teaching/learning materials
- Creative lessons

 Enrichment activities, including special onetime class/school projects



This year's first GIFT award goes to Cindy Cooper of Congregation Sinai for her project, *Yahrzeit Luminaries*. Through this project, students learned about the importance of honoring loved ones who have passed as well as encouraged them to perform the ritual of lighting a yahrzeit candle as a way of honoring them. Students discussed terms like kavod and zachor as well as various Jewish symbols that could be etched into their luminaries. This project not only taught about important Jewish values, but also brought out artistic talents in the 6th and 7th graders in Sinai's religious school.

Cindy Cooper

Congregation Sinai (Yahrzeit Luminaries)

Cindy Cooper taught Sunday School for 2 years in Appleton, Wisconsin at Temple Moses Montefiore. For the last 40 years, she has been teaching at Congregation Sinai and during that time, Cindy also taught art at the CBINT religious school for 5 years. Because of her stint as Creativity Center artist at Coalition for Jewish Learning, she spent 28 memorable years getting to know many other Jewish teachers from the day schools and supplementary schools. Cindy is a past recipient of the CJL Educator of the Year Award.

This year's second GIFT award goes to Yonina Schlussel, Mara Kleiman and Bobby Ehrlich of Milwaukee Jewish Day School for their project, *Empowering Successful Jewish Studies Culture*. Through this project, students grew their appreciation and motivation to engage in their Jewish studies learning. The project included a multi dimensional approach in which the team facilitated a variety of experiences that helped the students gain a better appreciation of Jewish values and how meaningful they are to them and their families. They also invited the parents to learn alongside their children in school and created opportunities for ongoing continued conversations about Jewish values in their homes.

Yoni Schlussel: An artist, writer, and a teacher at Torah Academy of Milwaukee and the Milwaukee Jewish Day School. She also directs the women's programming for Congregation Beth Jehudah and is on the Community Planning and Allocations committee of the Milwaukee Jewish Federation. Her writing has been published in the Jewish Press as well as Binah and Ami magazines. She also has had her art

displayed in the Var Gallery. She is passionate about helping teachers bring their best selves to their classrooms and providing women with support and programming that inspires them to be their best selves. She lives with her family in Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

Mara Kleiman: Mara has worked at the Milwaukee Jewish Day School for 9 years in variety of roles, and is currently the

Director of Jewish Life and Learning. She is also an alumni and graduated in 2002. One of her latest projects includes leading the Jewish Studies team in writing a 3K-8th grade spiraled scope and sequence. Mara also spends a great deal of her time in Jewish music, including co-leading Shabbat Sing at MJDS and singing in the Milwaukee Jewish Community Chorale. Mara's most important role is being Ima to her three children, Rafi, Ari, and Orli, who she shares with her husband Matthew.

Bobby Erlich: This is Bobby's second year working with MJDS and first full year as a part of the Jewish Studies team! He enjoys working to reinvigorate

his student's connections with Judaism. Before MJDS, he spent three years as a 3rd and 4th grade teacher in Brooklyn, New York, as well as one year teaching English in Haifa. His current classes at MJDS are focused on the history of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict. He loves engaging with middle schoolers on these complex issues and giving them tools to navigate this conflict. Additionally, he helps coordinate the Repairing Together program at MJDS, which brings together Jewish, Latinx, Black and Native students from across Milwaukee to break down barriers. In his free time, he coaches baseball and enjoys watching movies with his cat. Hobbes.


