

# **Swatting**

#### **Definition**

Swatting is the act of making false emergency calls, often to 911 or other emergency services, with the intention of triggering a significant response from law enforcement, particularly specialized units like SWAT teams.

### Why

- Sparking a law enforcement response to waste or tie up police resources
- target a specific group
- instill fear

#### What to do and not to do.

- Do: Follow LEA instructions and when able share with MJF.
- Do not: Bombard LEA with calls or rush to location

#### WHAT ARE THE TYPES OF EVENTS THAT PEOPLE CALL IN THROUGH SWATTING?








In 2023 SCN tracked more than 449 swatting incidents and bomb threats, up 541% from 2022, as compared to a total of 23 between 2019 and 2021.

### **Bomb Threat**

Any communication that indicates the intent to detonate an explosive device or that a device is already present. The threat can be made to cause injury, death, or property damage, and it can be made even if the device doesn't exist.

#### **Assessing a Bomb Threat**

#### Low Risk

Lacks Realism: A threat that poses a minimum risk to the victim and public safety. The probable motive is to cause disruption. Some examples include:

- Threat is received via email or Voice Over Internet Protocol (VOIP) phone system
- Threat is vague and indirect
- Information contained within the threat is inconsistent, implausible, or lacks detail
- Caller is known and has called numerous times
- The threat was discovered instead of delivered (e.g. a threat written on a wall or email over the weekend)
- Threat is received across multiple jurisdictions and/or states and contains similar wording

#### **Medium Risk**

**Increased Level of Realism:** A threat that could be carried out, although it may not appear entirely realistic. Some examples include:

- · Threat is direct and feasible
- Wording in the threat suggests the perpetrator has given some thought to how the act will be carried out
- May include indications of a possible place and time
- No strong indication the perpetrator has taken preparatory steps, although there may be some indirect reference pointing to that possibility
- Indication the perpetrator has details regarding the availability of components needed to construct a bomb
- Increased specificity to the threat (e.g. "I'm serious!" or "I really mean this!")

#### **High Risk**

**Specific & Realistic:** A threat appear to pose an immediate and serious danger to the safety of others. Some examples include:

- Threat is direct, specific, and realistic; may include names of possible victims, specific time, and location of device
- Perpetrator provides his/her identity
- Threat suggests concrete steps have been taken toward carrying out the threat
- Perpetrator indicates they have practiced with a weapon or have had the intended victim(s) under surveillance

### **Bomb Threat Guidance**

#### In All Cases

- · Notify Decision Makers & authorities
- · Write/rewrite threat exactly as communicated

#### **Phoned Threat**

- Remain Calm & DO NOT HANG UP
- Signal on-site Decision Makers/authorities
- Copy down caller ID details if available
- Keep caller on the line and solicit info to fill out checklist thoroughly
- · Record if possible
- Remain on site for interviews afterward

#### **Verbal Threat**

- · If perpetrator leaves, note which direction
- Note description of person who made the threat (name, gender, height/weight/body size, distinguishing features, race, type/color clothing, hair & eye color, voice [loud, deep, accent])

#### **Written Threat**

- · Handle document as little as possible
- Note the date/time/location found, situations/conditions surrounding discovery/delivery, personnel who witnessed the threat
- Secure the threat, do not alter. If small, place in bag/envelope. If large, secure the location.

#### **Emailed Threat**

- · Leave the message open on the computer
- Print/photograph/copy message and subject line, noting date & time

### BOMB THREAT PROCEDURES

This quick reference checklist is designed to help employees and decision makers of commercial facilities, schools, etc. respond to a bomb threat in an orderly and controlled manner with the first responders and other stakeholders.

Most bomb threats are received by phone. Bomb threats are serious until proven otherwise. Act quickly, but remain calm and obtain information with the checklist on the reverse of this card.

#### If a bomb threat is received by phone:

- Remain calm & do not hang up, keep the caller on the line for as long as possible
- If possible, signal other staff members to listen & notify Site Decision Maker(s)
- If the phone has a display, copy the number and/or letters on the display
- Write down the exact wording of the threat
- Record the call, if possible
- Fill out the Bomb Threat Checklist immediately

#### If you receive a written threat:

- Handle the document as little as possible
- · Note date, time, and location the document was found
- Secure the document and do not alter the item in any way
- Notify the organization Site Decision Maker(s)

#### If you receive a social media or email threat:

- Do not turn off or log out of the account
- Leave the message open on the device
- Take a screenshot, or copy the message and subject line
- Note the date and time
- Notify the organization Site Decision Maker(s)
- \* Refer to your local bomb threat management plan for evacuation criteria

#### O NOT:

- Use two-way radios or cellular phone in close proximity to a suspicious item
- · Touch or move a suspicious item

# **Civil Unrest Preparedness**



#### PHYSICAL SECURITY

- Survey and remove loose items from the surrounding area that can be used as projectiles
- Remove all trash cans, construction cones and other debris (tables, chairs, signs, etc)
- Empty and lock dumpsters
- Ensure security systems, to include alarms and cameras (if applicable), are operational and doors and windows are secure
- Inspect fire extinguishers to ensure they are in working condition and readily available
- Ensure all window shades and curtains are closed

#### SECURITY PERSONNEL

- Based on local conditions, and if warranted, be prepared for additional security presence
- Be prepared to call law enforcement (9-1-1) in the event of violence or civil unrest
- · Be prepared for early dismissal and evacuation
- Be prepared to shelter in place

#### OPERATIONAL PROCEDURES

- Notify relevant individuals of changes in work schedules and/or closures
- Based on local conditions, and if warranted, close facility or telework
- Review access control policy; limit guests or visitors, if warranted
- Update local, state and federal law enforcement points of contact
- Update internal communications list
- Update emergency vendor contacts

#### PROTEST PREPAREDNESS

- Do not engage with protesters especially when entering or leaving your facility
- Plan and discuss with your staff what actions to take during the protest
- Avoid counter-protests or educational events at the same location as, or close to, the protest as they may spark avoidable conflict
- Be prepared to walk past or avoid protesters if returning to your facility
- Ensure policies effectively respect First Amendment rights

# Case Study - Intelligence

Email communication from (Call recipient)

Friends, I am directing this report to David Bass of the local FBI, David Hartman, our security director, Jeff Butler, our president, Roger Ziif, our treasurer, and Andrew Dittman of the police department, as well as Ari Friedman of the Milwaukee Jewish Federation.

It was bound to happen here eventually. I have been here five years and never received a phone call like this one. Here are the details:

Phone call received at Congregation

Time 3:13 pm Thursday May 2, 2024

Phone call received live from 608-xxx-xxxx

It says "Ettrick, WI"

All the caller said was: "I hope somebody burns down your f\*\*\*ing synagogue, you stupid kike"

They hung up before I could respond.

I am not one to judge whether this was just a disturbed individual or an actual threat, but both the police department and the FBI, as well as the Milwaukee Jewish Federation, have told me to immediately report any incident like this. The information above is all I have. I would be grateful for some guidance.


I will not share this information with anyone else, until I am instructed to do so by our president and the board.

  - Communicated with the Synagogue




 MJF ran a search. None of this was verified at the time however, this is the "path" the phone number took us down.

Marketplace Notifications

### Police actions based on intel share

 PD were able to speak with Makia Durham today (May 3<sup>rd,</sup> 2024) about the phone call. Although he did not openly admit to making the phone call, his answers to my line of questioning implied he did. He stated he did not have any intentions of causing harm to anybody and stated his statements were not a threat. He said he was just having a "bad day" yesterday and that he was "mad at Israelites".

## **Next steps**

• After speaking with Asst. District Atty Nick Passe, the suspect was served with a summons to appear in court Friday, May 17th. The charges will be Disorderly Conduct and Unlawful Use of Telephone, both with the "Hate Crimes" penalty enhancer. They are not going to pursue terroristic threats. ADA Passe is asking for a No-Contact with the Synagogue and for the suspect to be on GPS monitoring, with an exclusion zone around the Synagogue. Statute Description Severity
