Responding to security needs across Wisconsin

16 Wisconsin synagogues received security grants to hire **professional security guards** for the holidays and Shabbat

Provided security services or covered guard costs at **40 Jewish organizations** throughout the state since October 7 totaling over \$925,000



Addressing spiraling antisemitism

3,000 mostly secular students were **educated about the Jewish experience**

114 incidents of antisemitism investigated and addressed

Trained 1,116 educators in best practices related to **Holocaust education, content, and pedagogy**

Engaged 21,762 students in grades 5-12 through HERC's speakers bureau, in-class instruction, and field trips

Providing health and welfare resources
